Issues for Mayor Wayne Brown: Meeting 31 January 2023

Key Points:

Rural Unfairness:

- 1. Rural people and small rural communities pay 50% of Rodney's rates, yet the only services they get are roading and drainage. Instead AC's service provision and investment in Rodney is Urban centric (Public Transport, infrastructure, community facilities);
- 2. Representation is urban biased and needs to change (NAG has made submissions on this);
- 3. Local MP (Chris Penk) is interested in a local Bill to tag a % of Rodney (and Franklin) rates for roading to address rural unfairness.

Inefficiencies, overheads, bureaucracy:

- 1. AC structure does not work (not fit for purpose) for Rodney (and perhaps Franklin);
- 2. silo system means no service provision integration at local level;
- 3. Local Boards without decision-making authority or staff (2 shared governance helpers only!) are an inefficient overhead on AC expensive central AC staff are needed to produce papers, support LB deliberations, review, filter, and bring decisions and recommendations together for central/silo decision making. Most is just process with no added value. Rural concerns are ignored by the urban GB majority;
- 4. LB needs a Local Area Manager (staff) with authority to plan and direct silo service activity in the area and its provision This requires local level budgetary management;
- 5. Localism and proper subsidiarity needed (authority, accountability);
- 6. ratepayers want to see local rates for local services.

Central Planning is poor and wasted:

- 1. District Planning is uncoordinated and ignored; Rodney doesn't have a plan, just a collection of silo and (some e.g Warkworth) particular area plans;
- 2. plans, rules and by-laws are not enforced;
- 3. development occurs before infrastructure is ready (e.g. Matakana link road);
- 4. there is no accountability when changes are made; and
- 5. the consent process is being abused to by-pass regional plans (Spatial, Unitary, Long-term, Waste).

Question for Mayor

Cutting the bureaucracy – where are the promised staff (consultants, managers, committees, admin overhead) reductions?

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Other Points

Transport

- Urban-centric transport planning does not work for low density Rodney;
- Public transport (PT) options are too expensive and idealistic. (Urban planners are trying to make Rodney a suburb!);
- Transport funding needs review;
- RFT allocation review needed (big projects dominate and delay funding use roads can proceed tomorrow); and
- AT road funding is subject to operational budget demands e.g. meeting PT spending growth demands takes money away from road maintenance.

Local Issues

- 3 Waters support continued opposition offers nothing for Rodney (a stand-alone catchment area).
- Wayby Landfill contradicts AC Plans (waste management planning) and an environmental disaster, so who in AC approved AC supporting the consent application to overturn GB approved Unitary and WM Plans?
- Rodney Road maintenance and improvement critical (half of Rodney ratepayers are rural).
- Northern initiative youth, rural and digital focus like Southern Initiative it needs support to get off the ground.

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
